Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 22nd November 2019

The meeting was opened by the President Dr Mike Kinsella

19.01 Apologies for absence were received from Tom Barrett and Johannes Retief.

19.02 Presidents remarks

Mike Kinsella (MK) thanked the great SASWR team. The new website and online membership scheme are up and running and working well. Many thanks to Ben Howes, who has managed the transition almost singlehandedly. We also have an updated constitution for the first time since 2004. Thanks to Kathy Holder for helping to amend it.

19.03 Minutes of AGM 6 December 2018

MK pointed out that the meeting was opened by Andy Burgess, not MK. Otherwise the minutes were accepted with no other comments.

19.04 Hon Sec Report

This year the minutes from the previous AGM, the agenda, and any other information for the AGM were posted on the website in advance. Hopefully everybody received an email, inviting them to read the documents before the AGM. We plan to publish the minutes and agenda on the website before each AGM. The Spring meeting in North Devon was very successful. It succeeded in its aim to be a family friendly meeting, to replace the overseas meeting. Hopefully we will have similar success at the Truro meeting in May 2020.

19.05 Hon Treasurers report

Ed Morris (EM) told us that this SASWR meeting is on Twitter. He thanked the Bristol organising committee, Gemma Nickols, Helen Johnston and Andy Bartlett. For the first time at a SASWR meeting, we would be running a parallel session, an EEG workshop. He reported that the meetings make a profit, while subscriptions cover the running costs of the society, so our rates are probably set at about the right level. Tom Barrett, from Taunton will take over as treasurer from 2020.

19.06 Report from Editor of Anaesthesia Points West.

Mark Pauling, deputy editor, reported that from spring 2020, only members who have registered on the new electronic membership, would receive a copy of APW. Members can also request to receive only an electronic version of APW. Remember that SASWR offers a

travelling bursary; details in APW, Articles which are published in abstract form in APW can also be published elsewhere.
